DGTech

DGTech places data science and digital technologies at the core of its curriculum. At the same time, it offers an integrated education that combines traditional fields of science and engineering, such as applied chemistry and life sciences, as well as mechanical engineering and electrical and electronic engineering. Students will systematically explore the role of engineering in addressing the challenges of our future society. The program is built on three core pillars that support students' learning and focuses on fostering the ability to apply knowledge of data science to other fields, enabling students to create new values that transcend conventional boundaries. DGTech aims to cultivate individuals with passion and leadership to confront global issues—such as carbon neutrality, resource recycling, and biodiversity—and to drive innovation through Green Transformation.

SPSF

The SPSF program is implemented in six departments: Economics, Education, Global Studies, Journalism, Management, Sociology. It offers discipline-based courses where students can enhance their knowledge in their respective fields of study as well as interdisciplinary courses offered with the cooperation of other departments. This approach aims to establish curricula to work on finding solutions to sustainability-related issues and foster students' abilities to overcome them.

FLA

The mission of the Faculty of Liberal Arts (FLA) is to prepare students of diverse backgrounds to take the lead in bridging differences and promoting understanding in the complex world of the twenty-first century. After learning how to perform at a high academic level through the Core Program courses, students then choose one of the three offered majors (Comparative Culture; International Business and Economics; Social Studies) at the end of their third semester. The faculty's broad interdisciplinary curriculum allows students to expand their general knowledge, develop critical thinking, and to nurture a broad, humanistic mind-set.
